



Artist-in-Residence - Research Series 2019/20 Submission Guidelines

Criteria and Context:

Resources facilitated by Young Lungs during the residency:

- An artist fee of \$1,500
- A budget of \$2,000 for additional labour and/or materials
- Access to studio space. This year we are residing at Video Pool's The Output 100 Arthur St. which is an accessible space.
- Access to Young Lungs workshops
- Concluding roundtable discussion on the research
- Public presentations of the research
- Presentation of your work will be documented
- Research will be considered for a written and visual essay published on website and future publication

CONDITIONS:

Each artist/group is required to adhere to the following:

- Demonstrate/show their research at the Research Series presentation night open to the public
- Develop a workshop based on their research open to the public
- Share their process with a commissioned writer, photographer and other artists in series (ie. studio visits, conversation)
- Submit a final report at the end of the residency detailing activities and feedback

Submission Guidelines:

To apply please submit the following information to younglungs.wpg@gmail.com

1. Contact information
2. A description of the research project: Explain the inspiration for your project, why you wish to undertake it at this time. (Approximately 750 words)
3. Artistic statement (400 words or less) *For collaborations, this can be a combined statement or include the statements of each applicant*
4. Max 2 page CV (for each collaborator)
5. Biography of the lead artist(s): *If you are selected, this text could be used for promotional purposes (press release, website, social media, etc.)*
6. Brief description of a proposed workshop based on your research (150 words max)
7. Budget: ***This is a critical part of the application.*** *If you require more hours, or are working with a collaborator, this should be reflected in the budget. Make sure you are allocating enough towards maintaining a professional rate for all collaborators. Materials, mentorship/consultation, and specific requirements should also be considered.*
